## YOUR HEART DETERMINES HOW GOD'S WORD GROWS IN YOU

#### **QUESTIONS:**

MARK 4:3–8 Jesus told about four kinds of soil. Which one sounds most like your heart right now?

MARK 4:19 Jesus says that worries and wanting things (desires) can choke out God's Word from thriving in your life. What "thorns" are crowding your heart today and competing against the truth of Scripture?

MARK 4:20 This verse shows that hearing God, trusting God, and producing fruit are linked. The bottom line is this: to obey God is to hear from Him, trust what He says, and then apply His Word to our lives. We've said it this way—it's not known Truth that changes our lives; it's applied Truth. In other words, when we apply Scripture, we produce spiritual fruit. What helps you move from hearing to trusting and then applying God's Word? How have you seen that applying God's Word leads to a changed life?

MARK 4:21-23 Jesus talks about a lamp. How can you shine God's truth at home or work? Does your life light up and reveal God's Word and goodness, or does it create confusion and hurt the image of His Kingdom?

MARK 4:26-29 These verses show that God makes the seed grow. In what areas are you trusting God but not yet seeing the results you want? How can you trust Him with slow growth?

MARK 4:33 Jesus used stories to teach. What's one story from your life that shows God's goodness and faithfulness?

#### YOU CAN'T FOLLOW JESUS HALFWAY

#### QUESTIONS:

MARK 8:29 Jesus was gaining a lot of attention from His ministry, and everyone had an opinion about who He really was. Just like today, people still have different ideas about Jesus. So, He turned to His disciples and asked, "Who do you say I am?" It's important to know who Jesus truly is—or we can easily be led astray by other people's opinions. So, who is Jesus to you personally today?

MARK 8:31–33 Jesus began to tell His disciples about His upcoming suffering and death. But Peter didn't want that to happen—he wanted comfort instead of sacrifice. Why do we sometimes want comfort more than obedience? In what areas have you chosen comfort over obedience?

MARK 8:34 Jesus makes it clear what it looks like to be His disciple: "Deny yourself, take up your cross, and follow Me." What does it look like to "take up your cross" in everyday life?


MARK 8:35 Jesus said that whoever loses their life for Him will save it. How have you found that giving something up for Jesus actually grew your faith?

MARK 8:36–37 Jesus asked, "What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul?" What do people chase after that can't really satisfy the soul? What have you chased after in the past—or what are you chasing now? What does it look like to chase after Jesus instead?

MARK 8:38 Jesus makes it clear that following Him means being vocal about our faith. Over gender, race, or personal creed, to follow Him means we identify ourselves first and foremost with Him and His Word. Our culture often says faith is private, but Jesus teaches the opposite—He calls us to live and speak the Truth boldly. Are you open about your faith? Why or why not? When is it hardest for you to stand up for Jesus and biblical truth? Why do you sometimes hesitate to be courageous in sharing the gospel?

## WE SHOULD LIVE LIKE JESUS COULD COME BACK TODAY

#### **QUESTIONS:**

MARK 13:1–2 As the disciples admired the Temple, Jesus told them it would one day be destroyed. They were shocked because it sounded impossible. What are some things you trust in that might not last forever? How does that change how you see what really matters?

MARK 13:5-8 Jesus warned, "Watch out that no one deceives you." False teachers and troubling events will come, but they aren't the end. What lies or false ideas do people believe about God today? How can you guard your heart against them?

MARK 13:9-13 Jesus said His followers would face hard times—but He also promised the Holy Spirit would give them the words to say. What helps you stay strong when life is hard? How have you seen God give you the courage or words you needed at the right time?

MARK 13:24-27 Jesus described His return in power and glory. No matter how dark the world gets, He will come back for His people. How does knowing Jesus will return give you hope when the world feels broken or unfair?

MARK 13:31-32 Jesus said, "Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will never pass away," reminding us that no one knows the day or hour. How does trusting Jesus' Word help you stay steady in changing times? Since we don't know when He'll return, what is one practical way to live "ready" every day?

MARK 13:33-37 Jesus said, "Be on guard! Be alert!" and called us to not get distracted in our lives. What does living alert for Jesus look like in your life right now? We've always said, "If you ARE ready, you don't have to get ready." Are you ready for Jesus to come back? If He came back today, what would you hope to be found doing? What do you need to do today to be ready for Jesus' return?

## THE HOLY SPIRIT DOESN'T JUST GROW CHRISTIANS - THE SPIRIT BUILDS THE CHURCH

#### QUESTIONS:

ACTS 2:1–4 On the day of Pentecost, the believers were together in one place when the Holy Spirit came with power. They spoke in different languages, and everyone could understand the good news about Jesus. What does this moment teach you about the power and presence of the Holy Spirit? How can you tell when God's Spirit is working in your life?

ACTS 2:14–21 Peter stood up and boldly explained that what people were seeing was what God had promised long ago. When have you seen God use ordinary people to do something bold or surprising? Are you willing to let God use you this week? What do you think God wants to do in and through your life?

ACTS 2:22–24, 32–33 Peter reminded the crowd that Jesus died and rose again, proving He is both Lord and Messiah. Why is the resurrection so central to our faith? How would you explain it to someone who doesn't yet believe? Why does the resurrection of Jesus change everything?

ACTS 2:37 When people heard Peter's message, they were "cut to the heart." In other words, they felt conviction and wanted to change. When has God's Word touched your heart in a way that led to action? Why is conviction actually a good thing? Is there anything you've been convicted of lately?

ACTS 2:42–47 The Scripture tells us that all the followers of Jesus devoted themselves to learning, fellowship, sharing meals, and prayer. They cared for each other and gave generously. Which of those habits do you need to grow in most? What would it look like for you to live out that kind of community this year?

## BEING BRAVE FOR JESUS MATTERS MORE THAN BEING LIKED BY OTHERS

#### **QUESTIONS:**

ACTS 7:1-16 Stephen began his defense to the Sanhedrin (Jewish ruling council) by reminding everyone of Abraham's story. Long story short, God called Abraham to leave his home and trust His promises. How does Abraham's example encourage you to obey God even when it's uncomfortable or unknown?

ACTS 7:17-36 Stephen retold how God used Moses to lead His people out of slavery. Moses faced rejection, but God still had a plan. When have you felt rejected or overlooked while trying to do the right thing? How does it help to remember that God still sees and uses you?

ACTS 7:37-43 Stephen reminded them (the Sanhedrin) that the people of Israel often turned away from God, even after seeing His power. Why do you think people turn away from God today? How can you help the people you love turn to God and not away from Him? In what ways have you turned away from God?

ACTS 7:51-53 Stephen boldly said the leaders were resisting the Holy Spirit and rejecting God's Truth. Why is it sometimes easier to resist conviction than to repent? When have you realized you were resisting God's direction?

ACTS 7:54-56 When the people grew angry, Stephen looked up and saw Jesus standing at the right hand of God. What does that vision of Jesus show about how God honors courage and faithfulness? In what areas do you need to be more courageous today?

ACTS 7:57-60 As they stoned him, Stephen prayed for his enemies, "Lord, don't hold this sin against them." How could Stephen forgive in that moment? Who is someone you need to forgive—or start praying for—this week?

#### **QUESTIONS:**

ACTS 16:6-10 Paul and his team tried to go several different places to preach, but the Holy Spirit kept redirecting them until they saw a vision calling them to Macedonia. How do you know when God is closing one door and opening another? When has God redirected your plans for something better?

ACTS 16:13-15 In Philippi, Paul met a woman named Lydia who was already seeking God. When she heard the message of Jesus, "the Lord opened her heart." What does it mean for God to open your heart? When has God opened your heart to see/understand something new?

ACTS 16:22-24 After helping a girl find freedom, Paul

and Silas were beaten and thrown into prison for doing what was right. How do you respond when doing the right thing and standing on Truth brings pain, misunderstanding, or loss? What can we learn from their example?

ACTS 16:25 At midnight, while in prison, instead of complaining, Paul and Silas prayed and sang hymns to God. What does this teach us about worship? What is your favorite Christian song? How does praising God change you, even when nothing around you has changed yet?

ACTS 16:26-30 An earthquake shook the prison


doors open, and the jailer thought all the prisoners had escaped. But Paul shouted, "We're all here!" What does Paul's calmness and integrity teach us about trusting God during chaos? Are you normally calm and collected during chaos? What do you think that indicates about your faith?

ACTS 16:31-34 The jailer asked, "What must I do to

be saved?" That night he and his whole family believed and were baptized. How does this story show that God can turn any situation—even a painful one—into a chance to bring people to Jesus?

## GREAT LEADERS CARE MORE ABOUT FINISHING WELL THAN LOOKING GOOD

#### **QUESTIONS:**

ACTS 20:17-21 Paul reminded the Ephesian elders how he lived among them—with humility, tears, and trials—but never stopped teaching the truth. What stands out to you about Paul's example of leadership? How can humility and consistency make a bigger impact than talent or personality? What is something you need to be more consistent in?

ACTS 20:22-24 Paul said that the Holy Spirit was leading him to Jerusalem, even though he knew trouble was waiting there. He said, "I consider my life worth nothing... my only aim is to finish the race and complete the task." What does it mean to "finish the race" God has given you? What helps you keep going when obedience gets hard or costly? Is there something you've thought of quitting that you need to finish well?

ACTS 20:28-31 Paul warned the elders to watch over themselves and the church because false teachers would try to harm the flock. Why do you think Paul emphasized spiritual protection and discernment? Who has God asked you to look out for or shepherd in your own life? How well are you protecting them?

ACTS 20:32 Paul reminded the Ephesian elders that God's Word can build them up and keep them strong in the faith. How does God's Word strengthen you when you're tired, discouraged, or unsure what to do next? How well do you think you know God's Word? Are you committed to learning and memorizing God's Word? Why/why not?

ACTS 20:35-38 Paul reminded them of Jesus' words: "It is more blessed to give than to receive." Then they all wept, prayed, and embraced before he left. Why do you think generosity and deep relationships are such a big part of finishing well? Who has modeled that kind of love and service for you?

ACTS 26:12-15 On the road to Damascus, Paul met Jesus face to face. The light blinded him, and he heard Jesus say, "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting," Is there a moment that made Jesus real to you? What was it? How did you realize you needed His forgiveness?


ACTS 26:16-18 Jesus gave Paul a mission to open people's eyes and turn them from darkness to light. What mission has God given you where you live, work, or serve? How can your story help others see the light of Jesus?

ACTS 26:19-23 Paul said, "I was not disobedient to the heavenly vision." Even in prison, he kept telling everyone about Jesus' death and resurrection. How can you stay faithful to what God has called you to, even when it's hard? What does it look like to obey God fully this week?

ACTS 26:27-29 Paul asked King Agrippa, "Do you believe the prophets?" and said, "I pray that everyone who hears me may become what I am-except for these chains." How can you lovingly share your faith with someone who's curious but not yet ready? Who in your life needs to hear your story of what Jesus has done?

ACTS 27:9-11 Paul warned the ship's crew not to continue the voyage because danger was ahead, but they ignored him and kept going. When have you tried to warn someone and they didn't listen? What helps you stay patient when others won't take godly advice?

ACTS 27:13-20 The storm hit hard. The crew threw cargo overboard, and everyone lost hope of being saved. What do you do when life feels out of control? How do you keep faith when fear starts to take over?

ACTS 27:21-25 Paul stood up and told everyone to take courage because an angel had spoken to him: "Do not be afraid... God has graciously given you all who sail with you." What does this passage teach about trusting God's promises in difficult times? How has God given you peace when things didn't make sense?

ACTS 27:30-32 Some sailors tried to escape in a lifeboat, but Paul told the soldiers, "Unless these men stay with the ship, you cannot be saved. "Why is it tempting to "jump ship" when life gets tough? What does it mean to stay where God has called you, even when it's hard?

ACTS 27:33-36 Paul encouraged everyone to eat and trust God. Even in the storm, he gave thanks before everyone. What does Paul's gratitude in the middle of chaos teach you? What can you thank God for right now, even before your storm ends?

ACTS 27:42–44 The ship broke apart, but everyone reached land safely—just as God said. How does this ending remind you that God always keeps His promises, even when the path there is rough? Is there an area of your life that you are currently having to trust God's faithfulness?

EPHESIANS 4:4-6 Paul reminds the church that there is "one body, one Spirit, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God." Why is unity so important in the body of Christ? How can remembering what we share in common help us when we disagree?

EPHESIANS 4:11-13 God gives leaders—like pastors, teachers, and shepherds—to equip His people for ministry so the whole body grows stronger. How can you use your gifts to serve and strengthen others? What happens when every believer does their part?

EPHESIANS 4:15-16 Paul says we should "speak the truth in love" so the church grows and builds itself up. Why is it hard sometimes to speak truth in love? What's one way you can use your words this week to encourage someone?


EPHESIANS 4:22-24 Paul tells us to "put off the old self" and "put on the new self," created to be like God. What's one old habit, attitude, or pattern God wants you to leave behind? What's one "new self" quality you want Him to grow in you?

EPHESIANS 4:29-32 Paul finishes by saying our words should build others up, not tear them down. How can your words bring life to people around you this week? Who do you need to encourage this week?

#### **REAL REST IS FOUND IN A REAL SAVIOR**

#### **QUESTIONS:**

HEBREWS 4:1-2 The writer of Hebrews warns Christians not to miss God's rest like the Israelites did, who heard His word but didn't mix it with faith. What does it mean to truly trust God instead of just hearing about Him? How can faith help you find peace even when life feels busy or uncertain?

HEBREWS 4:3-5 God's rest has been available since creation, but many people never enter it because of unbelief. Why do you think people often look for rest in things like success, comfort, or entertainment instead of in God? Where do you look to be recharged in your life?

HEBREWS 4:9-11 There remains a "Sabbath rest" for God's people. A Sabbath rest is basically a spiritual rest found through Jesus, not through our own work. What's the difference between physical rest and spiritual rest? How does trusting Jesus free you from trying to earn God's approval? Are you in need of rest today?

HEBREWS 4:12 God's Word is alive and powerful. It can "cut deep," exposing our hearts and showing what's really inside. How has God used Scripture to show you something about yourself lately? Why is that both uncomfortable and good?

HEBREWS 4:14-16 Jesus is our great High Priest who understands our weaknesses and invites us to come boldly to the throne of grace. What helps you remember that Jesus understands your struggles? How can you come to Him with confidence this week?

HEBREWS 11:1 The writer defines faith as "confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see." What does that definition mean to you in your own words? When have you had to trust God before you could see the result?

HEBREWS 11:6 Without faith, it's impossible to please God, because those who come to Him must believe that He exists and that He rewards those who seek Him. Why do you think faith is so important to God? What are some ways you can actively seek Him this week?

HEBREWS 11:8-10 Abraham obeyed God even though he didn't know where he was going. He trusted that God would lead him step by step. How can Abraham's example encourage you when the future feels unclear? What helps you keep moving forward in obedience when you can't see the whole picture?

HEBREWS 11:23-29 Moses chose faith over fear. He trusted God to lead His people out of Egypt and through the Red Sea. What fear are you facing right now that requires faith to overcome? How has God helped you be brave before?

HEBREWS 11:32-34 The writer lists other people like Gideon, David, Samuel, and many more who saw God's power because they trusted Him. Whose story in this chapter inspires you most, and why?

HEBREWS 11:39-40 These heroes of faith didn't receive everything promised in their lifetime, but they trusted God's plan anyway. What does that teach us about trusting God's timing? How can you stay faithful even when prayers aren't answered yet?

HEBREWS 12:1 The writer tells us to "throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles" and to run with perseverance the race marked out for us. What sins or distractions are slowing you down in your walk with God? What would it look like to let go of them and run freely again?

HEBREWS 12:2 We are called to fix our eyes on Jesus, who endured the cross and is now seated at God's right hand. How does focusing on Jesus help you stay strong when life is hard? What are some practical ways to "fix your eyes" on Him this week?

HEBREWS 12:5-6 Just like a good parent trains a child, God disciplines those He loves. How does it change your attitude toward correction to know it comes from love? When has God's discipline actually made you stronger?

HEBREWS 12:11-13 Discipline can feel painful for a while, but it produces "a harvest of righteousness and peace." How have hard seasons helped grow your faith? What lesson or strength came out of a time you didn't enjoy in the moment?

HEBREWS 12:14-17 The writer urges believers to live in peace with everyone and to stay away from bitterness and sin. What relationships in your life could use more peace or forgiveness? What steps could you take this week to pursue that?

HEBREWS 12:28-29 We are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, so we should worship God with gratitude and awe. How does remembering God's unshakable kingdom help you stay grounded? What are you thankful for right now that shows His goodness?
